Jyotirao Phule coined the term "Dalit" as a more descriptive and sympathetic term for the Untouchables. During India's push for independence, activists such as Mohandas Gandhi also took up the Dalits' cause. Gandhi called them the "Harijan," meaning "children of God," to
